

Adam's reflection on his role as Senior Class President and his new journey to Union College.



Do you like working with children? Ever wondered what it's like to work in a park or garden? Spend your summer working outside as member of the High Line Summer Youth Corps.

As a member of the Summer Youth Corps, you will work as a team, supervised by Friends of the High Line staff. You will assist High Line Educators in leading two family programs a week on the High Line park, leading art and nature activities and supervising children and their caregivers.

Typical weekly work hours are July and August, Wednesdays, 11 AM- 7 PM, and Thursdays & Saturdays 8:30 AM -4:30 PM. Training is scheduled to begin in late June.

You must attend orientation on Saturday, June 20.

This position is \$10/hour.

POSITION DESCRIPTION | High Line Youth Corps

The High Line is a public open space on a disused, elevated rail structure on the west side of Manhattan. Friends of the High Line (FHL) is the NYC Department of Parks & Recreation's non-profit partner working to ensure the park on the High Line is maintained as a great public place for all New Yorkers and visitors to enjoy. In addition to overseeing the maintenance, operations, and public programming for the High Line, Friends of the High Line is currently working to raise the essential funding to help complete the High Line's construction and create an endowment for its future operations. FHL offers a year-round schedule of innovative free and low-cost programs for the public and members.

DUTIES

Youth Corps members will work in pairs or small groups, supervised and guided by Friends of the High Line staff. Members of the Youth Corps Staff will support the High Line's as a public park in a variety of ways:

- <u>Education & Kids</u>: Prepare art supplies and materials for workshops, assist educators and family participants during events, and help facilitate fun activities with kids
- <u>Community Engagement:</u> Help share the news of what's happening at the High Line by distributing program announcements at selected neighborhood sites
- Administrative Assistance: Perform data entry regarding program participants and other administrative tasks as necessary

QUALIFICATIONS

Ideal candidates will be energetic, enthusiastic, dependable, flexible about trying new tasks, attentive, and friendly. Young people with experience or interest working with kids and families are encouraged to apply.

Youth Corps will work both outdoors on the High Line with the public and in the office with High Line staff, depending on each day's assignments.

You must attend orientation on Saturday, June 20 and work through August 31, 2015

This position pays \$10 per hour.
